With the days steadily growing longer and the return of the light, it's time to start thinking about your summer garden! These colder months are a good time to make a seed sowing plan, tidy up around the garden, weeding and feeding the soil with muck and seaweed. And it's finally time to start sowing seeds again! Sow brassicas like cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli for planting outside in April, and dark leafy greens like spinach, chard and salads to go undercover in March.

We'll be sowing some of these at the Warm Spaces Community Event at Ollaberry Hall on March the 3rd. Come along for a cup of tea and a chat with like-minded growing enthusiasts, we'll have seed catalogues to order from, or get inspired by.

This month we've delivered compost to the three schools as they get ready for the growing season.

"Whether the weather be Cold, or whether the weather be hot We'll weather the weather, whatever the weather, whether we like it or not."

Another WET month to begin the New Year! Total Rainfall was 206mm, 8inches, 124% of the average. (This was almost exactly the same as last month's December rainfall.) No wonder we are afloat! However there was very little snow, but rough wintry showers throughout the month, often in the form of grains or pellets.

As for Sunshine hours, we had a poor 17.2hours, 25% of 30 year average. This was an improvement of 7 hours more than last January, 2022!

Now for the Wind: eleven days with at least Force 5 winds blowing for parts of the day, but leaving 2 gale days for the end of the month for Lerwick Up Helly Aa. Highest gust in Ollaberry was 51mph, Force 9.

The Mean Temperature for the month was 4.8 deg.C, up by +0.5 deg.Celsius from the average, but often feeling very cold in the wind chill. Once again during a 24hr day, the Maximum temperature was during the night time!

At least there is hope as the daylight hours increasing before us.

P.S. I was looking back in my weather records of the past 20 years and discovered that in 2007 January Rainfall was 11 inches. (1 inch = 25mm) 2015 January Rainfall was 13.3 inches.
