September Gardening Jobs

As the summer is now winding down, it is a good time to clear out some of your summer crops that have been growing under cover and plant out things that will over winter. You will need to maintain good ventilation in your undercover space but can start to reduce watering if necessary.

Early September is still a good time to plant salad leaves. If you are planning to over winter crops such as leeks, sprouts, cabbage and purple sprouting broccoli outside, it is a good idea to think about wind protection before the equinoctial gales arrive.

September is really the last chance to prune your stone fruit trees too before it gets too cold.

Late September is a good time to plant Autumn garlic in raised beds outside or in tunnels which will be ready next June/July.

Don't forget about the Growing Local Produce Show on Sunday 10th September in the North Roe & Lochend Hall.

Joy's Weather Station, Ollaberry

"Whether the weather be Cold, or whether the weather be hot We'll weather the weather, whatever the weather, whether we like it or not."

After the warm and sunny summer month of June, the month of July was a month we all recognised as "Shetland Weather "! A mix of sun, rain and temperatures, all uncannily close to the 30 year average:

Viz. Sunshine 114.5 hours, 92%

Rain 91.0mm, 110%

Temperatures:

Mean Temperature 13 deg. Celsius, average 12.8 C. Mean Max Temperature 15.5 deg. Celsius, average also 15.5 C. Mean Min Temperature 10.5 deg. Celsius, average 10.1 C. The cloud covering the sky was on average 6 oktas (eighths).

The good point was that the wind-speed average was 5.8 mph, only 1 mph higher than June's total, and therefore 2nd lowest since 2004. (my records began). This, although mainly from the North and East, made it feel not quite as cool as it could have done.

The last few days of the month were the worst. Thick fog and mist with often humidity levels reaching 100% at times.

Fortunately, the Tall Ships Race was just before this and went ahead successfully.
