August & September Weather Report from Joy French, Ollaberry



August

SUN

Amazingly the sun shone everyday during August, even though on 5 days it was less than 0.75 of an hour! The total of 167.5 hours surprised me as this was 124% of the 30year average for this month, the norm being 130 hours. It was the early morning sun before 9am on 13 days that helped. The highest daily sun on the 4th was 11.27 hours, before dropping below the hill in the West in the evening.

RAIN

For all that, it was a WET month, with some rain on 25 days, which left 6 dry days. The total rainfall of 156mm, just over 6 inches was 144% of average.

Most daily fell on 19th with 17.8mm, closely followed by 17.7mm on 21st.

WIND

For the first time in any month since records began in 2004 there were no Easterly winds at all, i.e. NNE round to SSE, hence Westerly wet winds took precedence. We had 7 completely calm evenings and 2 at Force 1, so we were able to sit outside and enjoy the sun.

TEMPERATURES

The highest temperature was 19.4deg.Celsius (always measured in the shade) on 13th, lowest 8.1deg.C. on 21st, and lowest grass level of 5.0deg.C, also on 21st. The mean temperatures for the month were all exactly the same as the 30 year average, viz. Mean Max 15.7 deg. C., Mean Min 10.5 deg. C. and overall Mean temperature 13.1 deg. C. I will leave you with the clap of Thunder & Lightning (TL), rumbles and rain, on the afternoon of the 16th at 3pm GMT for a short while.

September

WIND

September used to be known as a windy month with high winds and gales, but this September has had the lowest average windspeed of 6.9mph since I began to take records here in 2004. This month it has been a generally quiet time, with 23 evenings which were calm, apart from 11th when the maximum gust just reached gale force, 39mph.

RAIN

After a dry start with only 5mm rainfall in the first week, the BIG RAIN arrived in the evening of 9th into all day of 10th, 30 hours in all ,yielding 64.6mm (2.6inches), and Thunder and Lightning in the afternoon. In spite of all this the total rainfall for September was just below average, 120.8mm (95%).

SUNSHINE

Sunshine hours were above average, 121 hours (115%). Most sun in a day was 10.70hrs. on 5th, followed by 10.20hrs. on19th.

HIGH PRESSURE

Pressure rose during the 3rd week into the 1030's millibars, when we would hope for warm, sunshine but this time it brought us 4 days of totally dark, cloudy, dull skies, and cooler temperatures. It felt like winter again.

TEMPERATURES

Maximum temperatures were between 10 - 12 Celsius, with the highest on 6th and 7th, reaching 20.8C and 21.6C respectively. The last week became steadily colder when the minimum temperature fell to 2.5C, and the grass was down to 0.0C, with hail in the blustery showers on 28th.

One of the joys of the month was the enormous full moon.
