February Weather 2025 by Joy French, Ollaberry
Whether the Weather be cold, or whether the Weather be hot,
We'll whether the Weather, whatever the Weather, Whether we like it or NOT!

#### And we did like it !!

February's four weeks were so good after the long dark winter.

**Sunshine hours** leapt up to 90hrs, which was the most in any February since records began here in 2004, and this was 131.8% of the 30 year average. The most sunshine which shone in any day during the month was 6.99hrs on 17th. A further 6 days saw 6hrs. plus. These were some of those gloriously sunny days with blue skies.

There were 7 sunless days, but 4 of these were at the beginning of the month, continuing January's pattern.

**Rainfall** was very low with 60mm, which was only 43.5% of the February average, and second only to Feb 2021 with 47mm, both since 2004. Most rain in a day was 13.7mm on 21st. 12 days were completely dry.

Wind In spite of all of this, the wind still had a nip in it.

The gales came in the third week, all gusting above 50mph, and the highest here gusting to top Force 10, which reached 63mph.

**Temperature** Remembering February is still a winter month, the lowest grass temperature was -6.1degC, there were 15 days of ground frosts on those clear nights, just 1 day with an air frost, and one odd sleet shower. The highest Maximum temperature was 10.4 degC on 21st, the Minimum was -1.5degC. and the overall MEAN for the month was 5.5degC, which was +1.4degC above the February average.

#### Other Phenomena

The PLANETS. You may have seen a number of our planets passing Earth, across our Western sky from sundown into early evening. How bright was the most westerly planet, Venus, which we call our "evening star". It is our nearest planet. Into the summer time it will be seen as our "morning star", coming up early in the east. Even with our naked eye we could have seen even Saturn, high above us in the sky, just looking like an ordinary star, as it is so far away. Sadly all this will not occur again until 2040!

#### **Aurora**

Also there were several occasions when aurora was seen in the Northern sky, if your timing was lucky, and the cloud allowed. We happened to see brilliant broad shafts, and a bright sky at 3am in the early hours of 27th!

The Shetland Islands Council Port Authority is undertaking a clean-up of all piers. As part of this initiative, we have launched a signage campaign ahead of any removals.

We would also like to draw your attention to the Sullom Voe Harbour Byelaws:
