




New Website

Weather Report for February & March from Joy French, Ollaberry

"Whether the weather be Cold, or whether the weather be hot, we'll weather the weather, whatever the weather, whether we like it or not

April Weather Report

As often happens on the last day of the month, it tips the figures all on its end! This happened on 30th April. That day had the maximum number of daily sunshine hours for the month, which 12.4 hours (3 of these hours before 9am!) Also it had the maximum daily temperature for April which was 14 degrees Celsius - both on the last day!

The Sunshine hours almost reached the 30 year average with 140 hours in all, at 95%. We enjoyed the clear blue skies when they came. However there were 5 sunless days, and midmonth there were some miserable, drizzly days with poor visibility.

Rain fell on 22 days, leaving us with 8 dry days. The total rainfall was 97mm (almost 4 inches) which was 121.7% of average. Most rain in a day, with some hail, was 15.7mm on 10th Thick sleet fell on 24th but soon thawed. No snow. Temperatures. Night time temperatures were below zero on 20 occasions, when night skies were clear for a few hours, giving rise to frosts. The lowest grass level temp was -4.9deg C. The lowest air temp was 1.8deg C. The Mean temp over all was 6.7deg C. which was just +0.2deg different from the 30 year average.

On 15 days the wind blew from the North and East sector, and included 3 gale days, 6th, 7th 8th days. The highest gust of the month was 46mph on 8th. There were no extreme gusts but 6 days in all reached 40 mph plus, the wind blowing steadily Force 7/8 mph rather than fluctuating with high gusts. No wonder we felt that chill factor.

End of Springtime. Beginning of Summer. Or so we hope!!
